@@@Turns the internal touchpad on and off. Turns the computer on and off. Enables/disables the wireless LAN function. Indicates the status of wireless LAN communication. Left and right speakers deliver stereo audio output. For entering data into your computer. @@@Comfortable support area for your hands when you use the computer. Indicates when the hard disk drive is active. Lights up when Num Lock is activated. @@To activate hotkeys, press and hold the <Fn> key before pressing the other key in the hotkey combination.
