It describes the monitor's features, setup, and operation. @@@@For information on the correct power cord set to use with your monitor, see Power Cord Set Requirements. WARNING: To reduce the risk of electric shock or damage to your equipment, do not disable the power cord grounding feature.

The grounding plug is an important safety feature. Connect the equipment to a grounded (earthed) power outlet. WARNING: For your safety, be sure that the grounded power outlet you plug the power cord into is easily accessible to the operator and located as close to the equipment as possible. @@Never pull on the cord. @@Not all power strips provide surge protection; the power strips must be specifically labeled as having this ability. Use a power strip whose manufacturer offers a damage replacement policy so you can replace your equipment if surge protection fails. Safety Precautions CAUTION: Avoid applying pressure to the LCD screen; doing so can cause damage. · Use only a power source and connection compatible with this monitor, as indicated on the label/back plate of the monitor. · Be sure the total ampere rating of the products connected to the outlet does not exceed the current rating of the electrical outlet, and the total ampere rating of the products connected to the cord does not exceed the rating of the cord. Look on the power label to determine the ampere rating (Amps or A) for each device.

· Install your monitor near an outlet that you can easily reach. Disconnect the monitor by grasping the plug firmly and pulling it from the outlet. Never disconnect the monitor by pulling the cord. · Do not allow anything to rest on the power cord. Do not walk on the cord. Maintenance Guidelines To enhance the performance and extend the life of your monitor: · Do not open your monitor cabinet or attempt to service this product yourself. Adjusting the Tilt For optimal viewing, adjust the screen tilt to your own preference, as follows: 1 Face the front of the monitor and hold the stand so that you do not topple the monitor while changing the tilt. 2 Adjust the tilt by moving the monitor's top edge toward or away from you. CAUTION: To avoid breakage or other damage, do not touch the LCD screen while changing the tilt. Connectors are on the back of the monitor. 1 Turn off your computer. 2 Connect the built-in monitor speakers to the computer, using the audio cable (green connector).

3 Connect one end of the 15-pin D-Sub VGA cable (blue connector) to the back of the monitor and connect the other end to the computer VGA port. 4 Connect one end of the power cord to the back of the monitor and plug the other end into a grounded outlet. 5 Turn on your monitor and computer. If your monitor displays an image, installation is complete. If it does not display an image, see Technical Support FAQs and Using the Monitor.

CAUTION: Before disassembling the monitor, turn off the monitor power, and disconnect all power, video, and audio cables. 1 Disconnect the cables from the monitor. 2 With the panel face-down on a protected surface, remove the screws and the pedestal attachment. 3 Follow the manufacturer's instructions to assemble the wall mounting arm. See Installing a Wall Mounting Arm for further installation instructions. Installing a Wall Mounting Arm 1 Set the monitor screen down on a flat, soft, protected surface.



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2 Place the wall mounting arm onto the back of the monitor. Line up the holes of the arm with the mounting holes in the back of the monitor. 3 Insert four screws into the mounting holes and tighten. 4 Reconnect the cables. @@@@ Press the power button to turn the monitor on and off. The power indicator lights up when the monitor is on. The monitor must be turned on for the other control buttons to work. @@@@ Check with your computer manufacturer.

@@@@. Adjust the Image Setup feature in the OSD main menu. @@@@. The computer video card should be snugly seated in its slot.

@@@@. The auto-adjustment function may fix this problem. · Adjust RGB color or select color temperature.

@@@@. In addition, the cross-sectional area of the wire must be a minimum of 0.75 mm<sup>2</sup> (0.03 in<sup>2</sup>) or 18AWG, and the length of the cord must be between 1.5 m (4.94 ft) and 3.6 m (12 ft).

If you have questions about the type of power cord to use, contact your HP-authorized service provider. A power cord should be routed so that it is not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon it or against it. Particular attention should be paid to the plug, electrical outlet, and the point where the cord exits from the product.
