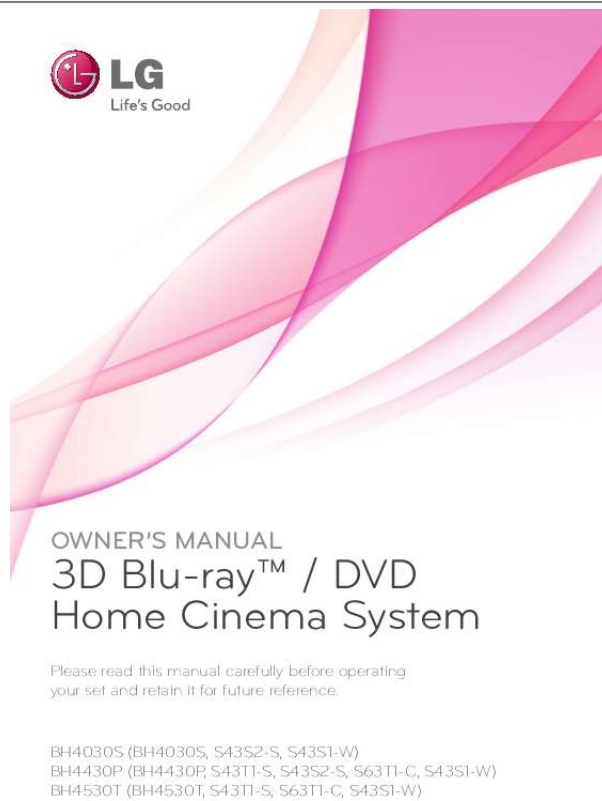

Press PRESET (- / +) to select a preset number you want to delete.
