A Motorola icon appears in your task bar, in the lower right of your computer screen. If you have Motorola Media Link, it will launch instead of Phone Portal. To use Phone Portal, right-click in your task bar, select "when the phone connects, Tip: When your phone's Wi-Fi is on, it automatically reconnects to nearby networks it has used.

To turn Settings > Wireless & Wi-Fi on or off, touch > networks > Wi-Fi. If your phone is not connected to a Wi-Fi network, it asks you to connect.



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
