Find it: > Music > Radio add to playlist use as ringtone delete Touch Menu Add to playlist. > More > > More > > More > Touch Menu Set as ringtone. Touch Menu Delete. Hide, wake, turn off Touch Home to use another app. Your music will continue to play.

When you see in the status bar a song is playing, flick down to see details.



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
