

Settings Battery life Your phone is like a small computer: tons of information and apps at lightning fast speed.

Depending on what you use, that can take a lot of power. To see what's using up battery power, touch Apps Settings > Battery. > Settings To turn on Battery saver, touch Apps > > Battery, then touch Menu > Battery saver. • Widgets that stream information to your home screen, like news or weather. • Unused online accounts that you registered: Touch Apps Settings > Accounts.
