· Taking Pictures in Normal Mode You can take pictures at approximately 2.6 feet to infinity (80 cm to infinity). NOTE: Most settings are saved by the camera when the power is turned off so that the same settings are automatically available when the power is turned on again. Make sure you verify your settings when turning the camera on again.

The main purpose of using aperture-priority mode is to control the Depth of Field.

A higher aperture value brings the background out of focus. Selecting a lower aperture value allows you to soft the background. Using the Shutter Priority Using the shutter-priority mode, you select a shutter speed and the camera chooses an appropriate aperture value to match the brightness. The main purpose of using the shutter-priority mode is to have a faster shutter speed to freeze the action of fast-moving subjects or to have a slower shutter speed to blur moving subjects in order to create a sense of motion. Faster shutter speeds allow you to take a sharp picture of a moving subject while slower speeds create a trail effect and allow you to shoot without a flash in dark areas. Using the Manual Exposure Using the manual exposure mode, you can set both aperture and shutter speed, and, therefore, you have complete control over the exposure system, including exposure compensation.

You can expand the memory using a Polaroid SD card (up to 2GB, when using SDHC up to 4GB). The camera senses whether a memory card is inserted, and automatically saves pictures and video clips accordingly. Note that you cannot save pictures or video clips to the builtin flash memory while a memory card is installed in the camera. See pages 101 to 104 for storage capacities.

Memory card precautions: 1. Use only a SD memory card with this camera. 2. Electrostatic charge, electrical noise, and other phenomena can cause data corruption or even loss. Always make sure that you always back up important data on other media (MO disc, computer hard drive, etc.). 3. If a memory card starts to behave abnormally, you can restore normal operation by formatting it. However, we recommend that you always take along with more than one memory card whenever using the camera far away from your home or office. 4.

We recommend that you format a memory card when using it for the first time, or whenever the card you are using seems to be the cause of abnormal pictures.
