To use this function, additional telephones must be set to the tone dialling mode (DTMF/MFV tones) (for this purpose see the operating manual of your additional telephone).

Call signal clock pulse detection Using an External Answering Machine For the best operation, the answering machine must be connected to the EXT socket of the device. Answering machine pause duration If the call signal clock pulse is not detected by the fax machine, RING NOT DETECT.appears on the display. Press j and repeat the process.

Make sure that the pause duration set on the external answering machine is longer than the one on the fax machine. Otherwise the answering machine automatically picks up each call including faxes. If the external answering machine has a "conserving function" (i.e. a function that changes the number of rings as soon as new messages have been recorded), switch it off. 28 8 Service Changing the ink cartridge Original Consumable Materials 3 Press the lock in the centre of the holder towards the front and lift the cartridge. Use only original consumable materials. These are available from a specialised retailer or through our order service. Other consumable materials can cause damage to the machine. For receiving or copying documents, an ink cartridge must be inserted in your device. If no cartridge is present or the cartridge is incorrect, CHECK PRINT HEAD appears on the display.

If the ink in the cartridge is over, OUT OF INK appears on the display. The ink cartridge cannot be refilled! 1 Open the control panel, by lifting and folding it up in the centre. Click the control panel completely in place. 4 Remove the cartridge by pulling it up diagonally forward and taking it out. Dispose of the empty cartridge according to the regulations of your country. Fixing a document jam 1 Open the control panel, by lifting and folding it up in the centre. Click the control panel completely in place. 2 Carefully pull the paper out.

Cleaning the cartridge If the quality of the printed documents diminishes, the cartridge must be cleaned. 1 Press MENU several times until HEAD MAINTENANCE appears on the display. 2 Confirm using o. 31 Power Cycling If a problem occurs that cannot be corrected with the instructions in this user manual (see also the help below), follow the steps given here. 1 Pull out the power plug.

2 Wait at least ten seconds, then plug the power plug back into the socket. 3 If the error occurs again, please contact our technical customer service or your retailer.



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
