

Tap and hold the empty area on the Home screen, and then select one of the following categories: â□¢ pps and widgets: Add widgets or applications to the Home screen. Moving an item Tap and hold an item and drag it to a new location. To move it to another panel, drag it to the side of the screen. To enter text, you must change the input language to one of the supported languages. Changing the keyboard type Tap any text field, open the notifications panel, tap Choose input method, and then select the type of keyboard to use.

Using the Samsung keyboard Changing the keyboard layout Tap â  $\square$  Portrait keyboard types, and then tap Qwerty keyboard or 3x4 keyboard. On the 3x4 keyboard, a key has three or four characters. To enter a character, tap repeatedly the key corresponding to the character. Break to the next line. Joining Wi-Fi networks On the Applications screen, tap Settings â□□ Wi-Fi, and then drag the Wi-Fi switch to the right. Select a network from the list of detected Wi-Fi networks, enter a password if necessary, and then tap Connect. Networks that require a password appear with a lock icon.

After the device connects to a Wi-Fi network, the device will automatically connect to it any time it is available. 31 Basics Adding Wi-Fi networks If the desired network does not appear in the networks list, tap Add Wi-Fi network at the bottom of the networks list.



Enter the network name in Network SSID, select the security type and enter the password if it is not an open network, and then tap Save.
