Always turn off your phone and detach the charger before you insert or remove the SIM card. You can save contacts on the SIM card before you remove it from your phone.

Charging the battery The phone battery is partly charged when you buy it. The phone battery cannot be removed. To charge the battery 1 2 Connect the charger to the phone. Remove the charger by tilting the plug upwards. Maximising battery performance . . . Charge your phone often. The battery lasts longer if you charge it frequently. If you are in an area with no coverage, your phone repeatedly scans for available networks. This consumes power. If you cannot move to an area with better coverage, turn off your phone temporarily. Turn off 3G and Bluetooth™ wireless technology when you do not need these functions.
